RESOLUTION 2022-014

RESOLUTION TO PLACE THE CONTINUATION OF A 2% LODGING TAX ON THE GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT TO BE HELD IN ALBANY COUNTY, WYOMING ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Legislature has provided, pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 39-15-204(a)(ii) for counties and towns to impose a lodging tax not to exceed two percent (2%) upon the sales price paid for lodging services, the purpose of which is for local travel and tourism promotion; the funding for visitor impact services, which include, but is not limited to, provision of vehicle parking, public transportation, public restrooms, pedestrian and bicycle pathways, museums and other displays;

WHEREAS, in 2014, with concurrence by 2/3 of the municipalities in Albany County, the Board of County Commissioners of Albany County placed the proposition to impose a lodging tax of four percent (4%) on the ballot. That proposition was passed by the voters at that time and again by the voters in 2018;

WHEREAS, Wyo. Stat. § 39-15-203(a)(ii)(D) states that if the proposition is approved, the same proposition shall be submitted at subsequent general elections until the proposition is defeated; and

WHEREAS, if the below proposition is approved by the qualified electors, the Board of County Commissioners shall impose a two percent (2%) lodging tax upon the sales price paid for lodging services as they are defined by W.S. § 39-15-101(a)(i).

NOW THEREFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ALBANY COUNTY, WYOMING, RESOLVES

Section 1: That the foregoing recitals are incorporated in and made a part of this resolution by this reference.

Section 2: That pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 39-15-201 et seq., the Board of Commissioners for Albany County, Wyoming shall, at an election to be held in Albany County, Wyoming on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, place the following Proposition on the ballot:

TWO PERCENT (2%) LODGING TAX PROPOSITION

“Shall the Board of Commissioners of the County of Albany, State of Wyoming be authorized to continue to impose, as allowed by Wyoming Statute, a two percent (2%) excise tax upon the sales price paid for lodging services within Albany County, the primary purpose of which is for local travel and tourism promotion?”

FOR THE COUNTY LODGING TAX _____

AGAINST THE COUNTY LODGING TAX _____

Section 3. That if passed the proposed two percent (2%) lodging tax shall be re-submitted to the electors every four (4) years at every other subsequent general election hereafter until the proposition is defeated.


